

# Basic Lace Assortment



**T**ransform intricate lace doilies into delicate gifts. Lace is a perfect background for ribbon embroidery and pin beading.

## Recipe

### Patch Pillow

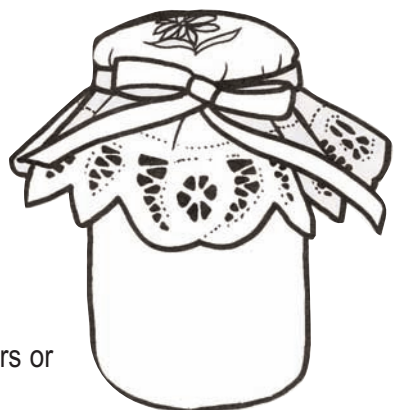
- 1/3 yard each of two coordinating fabrics
- Nine Wimpole Street Creations 3" or 4" square Battenburg doilies
- Two yards of light pom-pom trim
- Two yards of dark pom-pom trim
- Iron-on liquid fusible
- 16" square pillow form
- Matching thread

- Cut nine 6" squares from each fabric.
- Sew the squares together in a checkerboard pattern for the pillow front, using a 1/4" seam allowance. Reverse the squares to complete the pillow back. Press the seams.
- Overlap the light and dark pom-pom trim and pin around the right side of the pillow front, with the pompoms facing inward. Stitch the trim in place.
- Apply iron-on fusible to the wrong side of the lace and fuse onto alternating squares, following manufacturer's instructions.
- Pin the pillow front and back with right sides together, making sure the pom-pom trim is tucked inside the seam line. Sew around the pillow, using a 1/2" seam allowance. Leave an opening to turn right side out.
- Insert the pillow form and hand-stitch the opening closed.

## Recipe

### Fabric & Battenburg Jar Topper

- 6" or 8" Wimpole Street Creations fabric and Battenburg doily
- 4" square of bonded batting
- 3/4 yard of 3/8" ribbon
- Glass jar & lid
- Low temp glue
- Rubber stamp or stencil, fabric ink, markers or floss (optional)



Rubber stamp, stencil or stitch a design on the fabric center of the doily. Place the batting on the lid and trim away excess. Glue in place. Center the doily over the batting and tie the ribbon around the lid.

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## Recipe

### Christmas Stocking with Lace Cuff

- Wimpole Street Creations 4" square doily
- Fabric
- 6" of 3/8" matching ribbon



Trace the stocking pattern onto a separate piece of paper and cut two stocking pieces from the fabric. Cut the doily in half diagonally. Place the right sides of the stocking pieces together and sew around the edges using a 1/8" seam, leaving the top open. Center and pin the right side cut edge of the doily to the notch at the top of the stocking. Sew around the top of the stocking to attach the cuff. Turn the stocking right side out. Fold the cuff down and press. Fold the ribbon in half and stitch to the back seam for a hanger. Decorate as desired. Use the other piece of the doily for another stocking. You may enlarge the stocking 130% for a 6" square doily.

### White Stocking Tradition

Hang the white stocking in a special place. Ask each person to write on a piece of paper what their special gift would be for their family and friends. Place the papers in the stocking. The gifts could be personal goals, family goals or service to others in the coming year. Gather around the tree and read the ideas. Return the papers to the stocking to read the following year. Suggest a new gift each year.

## Recipe

### Doll Collar, Apron & Accessories

#### ■ Collar

Cut a small slit in the center of a Wimpole Street Creations doily. Pull the doily over the doll's head for a collar. Tuck the raw edges under and hand-baste or glue in place.

#### ■ Apron

Cut off a portion of a large or small Wimpole Street Creations doily to fit the doll. Gather the cut edge of a tea towel to fit the cut edge of the doily and stitch together (see diagram). Add ribbon ties, or hand-stitch to the doll.



#### ■ Angel Wings

Delicate angel wings can be made from Wimpole Street Creations doilies of any size or shape by pinching and securing the gathered center.

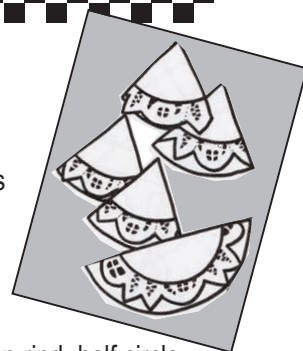
#### ■ Miniature Accessories

Make pillows by stitching two matching Wimpole Street Creations doilies together and stuffing. A round or square doily will make a beautiful table cover.

## Recipe

### Watermelon Scrapbook Page

- Three Wimpole Street Creations 4" fabric & battenburg doilies
- Background page
- Green and cranberry cardstock
- Glue



1. Use the outside curve of the lace as a guide to cut watermelon rind, half circle and wedges from the cardstock. Glue the cardstock pieces together.
2. Cut the center fabric from the doilies. Cut the lace into pieces to match the rind and glue in place.
3. Crop photos slightly smaller than the watermelon wedges and glue in place. Mount the watermelon photos to the page.
